Speaker Bill Golden:

If you like Pirates you'll love this one, you should have been here. Bill talked on behalf of the Real Pirates Museum in Salem

As a boy, Barry Clifford sat around the fish house listening to stories told by men who had

just come home from World War II. His favorite story was told by his Uncle Bill. It was the story of a pirate ship that had wrecked off the Cape - one that supposedly was full of the biggest pirate treasure ever known. And it was right here in his own backyard.

From the very first time he heard this story, he knew he wanted to try and find the wreck of The Whydah. And when he finally did, he realized that the real treasure of this shipwreck was not the gold, or jewels, but the stories he had found.

The Story of Black Sam Bellamy and the Whydah

Immerse yourself in the stories of Real Pirates!
The family-friendly pirate experience features
the true tale of "Black Sam" Bellamy - the
richest and one of the youngest pirates of all
time - and Maria Hallett, the love of his life and
so-called "Witch of Wellfleet."

During the early 1700s, Bellamy captured the infamous slave ship Whydah, as well as more than 50 other ships, earning him the nickname the "Prince of Pirates." Meet the crew and follow their journey as they seek fortune on the high seas, amass the greatest pirate treasure of all times, and ultimately meet their untimely fate when the Whydah sinks in a violent Nor'easter off the coast of Cape Cod.

See the world's only fully authenticated pirate treasure ever discovered - including coins, jewelry, and weapons - retrieved from the wreck, and last touched by the hands of pirates more than 300 years ago.

Sam Bellamy

Pirate, 26 years old, English Captain of the Whydah

Maria Hallett

Legendary "Witch of Wellfleet" and Captain Bellamy's true love

Hendrick Quintor

Pirate, in his 20s, Dutch African descent, crew member of the Whydah $\,$

John King

Pirate, 9 years old, runaway, crew member of the Whydah John Julian Pirate, 16 years old, Miskito, pilot of the Whydah

Barry Clifford found the Whydah Gally's wreck in 1984, relying heavily on Southack's 1717 map of the wreck site—a modern-day, true-to-life "pirate treasure map" leading to what was at that time a discovery of unprecedented proportions. That Whydah Gally had eluded discovery for over 260 years became even more surprising when the wreck was found under just 14 feet (4.3 m) of water and 5 feet (1.5 m) of sand [2]

The ship's location has been the site of extensive underwater archaeology, and more than 200,000 individual pieces have since been retrieved. One major find in the fall of 1985 was the ship's bell, inscribed with the words "THE WHYDAH GALLY 1716". With that, Whydah Gally became the first ever pirate shipwreck with its identity having been established and authenticated beyond doubt. The bell, inscribed, "THE WHYDAH GALLY 1716"

Work on the site by Clifford's dive team continues on an annual basis out of Provincetown, Massachusetts. Clifford opened The Whydah Sea-Lab & Learning Center in Provincetown after discovering the wreck and the center operated on MacMillan Pier until its move in 2016. Selected artifacts from the wreck are now displayed at The Whydah Pirate Museum in West Yarmouth, Massachusetts[23] and at Real Pirates in Salem, Massachusetts.[24].
