Abby has been tasked to bring Historic Beverly into the 21 st century. Historic Beverly now has a strong presence on social media and has expanded its outreach to citizens of all ages through new and engaging programming. Abby and her team have digitized over 78,000 of the million artifacts at Historic Beverly, a Herculean task Abby is proud to undertake.

Abby's main focus was the connection to Ken Burns' American Revolution and Historic Beverly.

Historic Beverly proudly presents the

American Revolution: a Story of the War in 28 Paintings. The paintings were commissioned by Henry Cabot Lodge in 1898 to depict Beverly's involvement and promote his 1902 book.

The Beverly exhibit will be on display at the Cabot House from September 6, 2025 - July 4 2026, tickets are free for the public. The paintings depict vivid battles scenes of grief, determination, and victory, honoring the 250th anniversary of America's independence, for more information visit historicbeverly.net/revolution.

Keeping it under wraps for three years, Abby has worked with Ken Burns and his team to bring forth the society's archives and paintings to be part of Ken Burns' next masterpiece. Abby was determined and successful to see many of Beverly's historic paintings be part of Ken Burns American Experience. Burns' team initially chose seven paintings and through persistence and advocacy, Abby convinced them to use fourteen. The visual narrative needed to get the story right shows a different world detailed today compared to Henry Cabot Loge's time.

Ken Burns and his team are also offering free educational materials for teachers, this is a wonderful opportunity to share the connections between Beverly and the American Revolution.
