

Last Week at Beverly Rotary

Meeting started at 12:15pm by Prez Sean.

Speaker:

Prez Sean introduced Tina Baptista from a Bed for Every Child, a beneficiary of Beverly Rotary's Spring Fundraiser.

A Bed for Every Child is affiliated with the Coglition for the Homeless which focuses on advocacy, providing material goods, and addressing homelessness, especially for elderly and disabled. Tina's remarks were



interrupted by a plethora of dropping utensils accentuating the urgency of need.

Ms. Tina graciously awaited for the excitement to subside, and then continued to share that the organization provides beds to children living in poverty. They work with schools, hospitals, and other nonprofit organizations like Beverly Bootstraps to identify children who could benefit. It is a statewide initiative helping 150 Massachusetts communities. Last year they served 1988 kids, including 21 in Beverly. Average age is 7.9 years old; mostly in singleparent households. Nearly half are Latino. They also provide backpacks and winter clothing.

A good night's sleep is as important as food and housing. Sleep hygiene is essential to wellbeing and academic success. They've been a beneficiary of Lynnfield Rotary, which now funds 120 beds annually. They partner with local vendors including a mattress dealer and Moynahan Lumber. Beds generally are twin-sized, but they can do custom beds for taller, heavier and/or younger children. Warehouse is located in downtown Lynn. They conduct Build a Bed workshops for volunteers - 2 hours, builder-friendly.Tina commented that she and Tuck (a 7-foot teddy bear mascot) will be at our fundraiser.

Matt P. shared that he has participated in the workshops through the Lynnfield Rotary - "it's a party!"

Mike H. noted they'll be onsite at our event and that there will be an opportunity to attendees to contribute directly to A Bed for Every Child.

Prez Sean indicated we'll be giving \$10k to fund 28 beds.

Sergeant Brian "Moiph" Murphy:

Noted he is a human daffodil in honor of spring (also decored with Shamrock beads, apparently forgetting that St. Patty's day was already a distant memory).

John S. - a happy \$20.

Classification Speeches:

Prez Sean introduced two new members giving their Classification speeches: Ellen and Adam.

Works in retail environment setting people up for a better future. (Fidelity at 77k employees is the largest family-owned business and as such has the ability to focus on longevity.)

As a student at MIT, didn't gravitate toward finance and felt out of her element. But then discovered that her talent was leadership.

As a manager at Kohls at the age of 24, she came into a branch that ranked 1250 out of 1250 in satisfaction. She asked questions, promoted from within, and in a year brought the store to #1 ranking - all with the same people; she just gave them the means to thrive.

Ellen serves as a big sister, on boards for women's causes. Excited to be a Rotarian.

Adam Standley; his older brother, his "Irish twin", is deaf and handicapped. Adam served as his caregiver and interpreter. His brother was often subjected to bullying; the brothers were thus obligated to give the bulliers the "rough treatment". At an event together where the Coach O'Shea Sportsmanship Award was being given, they again got into trouble. But instead of being kicked out, Adam as surprised to be honored with the award. Played hockey, football, lacrosse. A member of the Pink Floyd Graphix cover band.
